ICA VIDEO LIBRARY/CINEMATHEQUE.

Dear LVA Member.

The IOA is opening a videotheque which is described in the enclosed IOA circular. They wish to have a copy of every tape in the IVA library, with your permission as copyright holder, for inclusion in their library, after discussion with the IVA steering committee the IOA has produced a contract, a copy of which is enclosed for your information. - The basis of the ICA library will not compete with LVA as a distribution outlet for your work. It could be seen more as a showcase for work, or as a viewing theatre for prospective hirers of the LVA copy of your tape.
- 2. With regard to rysalties, £1.00 per hour, 50% of which is payable to you may seem little in relation to the LVA rete, but it should be remembered that this is £1.00 per personger hour, and that the tapes will be available every day. This is an untried method of payment, and only time will tell how it works in practice.
- 3. The IGA have suggested, where possible, that artists should make compilations to last as close to multiples of half an hour as is possible. Each half hour will be charged at 50p to a viewer, and it seems that tapes will be paid for by the IGA to the mearest half hour. Again it remains to be seen how this will work in practice. You can withdraw your work under the terms of item 2 on the IGA contract if you're not happy about the way things go.
- 4. The IGA have suggested that artists could have their royalties processed via IVA, as is the case with the London Flam makers Co-p agreement. This would mean that IVA would take 33a1/% of the 50% of the box office takings at the IGA. This it was suggested, would be an altrustic gesture that the suggested with the same of the support of the IGA unless you indicate otherwise.

- 5. The ICA would like to make copies direct from your masters but if this is not possible, do you agree to a copy being made from the tape in the LVA library?
- 6. The ICA's catalogue will contain LVA's address next to every tape which is available for hire through LVA, plus full information of procedure for hiring through LVA. This should be good promotion for further hirings of your work.
- 7. Putting a tape in the ICA library should not adversely affect future hiring of your work through LVA. As tapes cannot be shown outside the ICA, it would be impractical and costly for college parties to substitute trips to the ICA for hiring from LVA, though small groups may go, and then wish to hire from LVA for wider viewing at a provincial college or gallery.
- 8. No fees will be recieved by anyone for initial inclusion in the ICA library.

These points cover the main questions asked by the LVA steering committee of ALEC Graham and Archie Tate who are organising the videotheque. The final decision whether or not to include tapes remains with you, and there will be an open seeting at the IDA on the 275rd of March at 7.50pm where you can ask further questions and air your views on the project. However LVA will keep you informed of any other lesues which might arise, and will remain your
