Thank you for your letter of 10th September 1991.

Your letter of 8th August was read along with Christian Anstice's letter of resignation at the very end of the short-listing meeting of the same date. I said that we would reply as soon as possible as it was unfair to keep you waiting but that we had received no communication from the BFI on a suitable date.


My reply followed recommendations from the BFI Personnel Department, A.C.A.S. and N.C.V.O. (National Council for Voluntary Organisations). They advise that it is your right to know beforehand any items which may be brought up at a review.

The reply letter of 19th August is a factual response to your questions. It was discussed with 2 other executive members and a Director of LFMC. Owing to the confidential nature of the letter it was not filed in an open file for all to see, although a copy was sent to Ian Christie. It is not standard practice that all letters are "endorsed" by all the executive.

The meeting of 23rd July at which the vote was taken for a review was a quorate executive meeting, the calling of which was discussed at the end of the 18th July meeting. Everyone knew that it was taking place.
