### FUNDING OF FILM AND VIDEO IN LONDON


I am writing to update you on the situation in terms of the BFI's current funding of Greater London Arts and its attitude to the London Arts Board by attaching a discussion document, on which I would welcome your response.

As you will see from the paper, the BFI's Governing Body has decided to examine the possibility of not entering into funding the London Arts Board when it succeeds Greater London Arts later this year and, instead, to investigate the viability of creating an alternative mechanism for the delivery of London film and video funding and development by the creation of a Development Agency. The reasons for this, and the outline role of the Agency, are described in the document. We have now entered into a consultation period to determine views and ideas.

As your organisation is a part of the London film and video infrastructure, I would be most grateful if you could read the attached document and let me have your views. As part of the consultation process, I would welcome your comments and suggestions.
